

Keeping students drug-free requires a combination of actions, sustained over time, to prevent and reduce alcohol and other drug use. The Student Assistance Program is one component of an overall community prevention and early intervention strategy. These strategies, designed to reduce risk factors and promote protective factors, are most likely to succeed if they reach both individuals and the environments in which people live and work - family, school and community. It takes a combination of prevention, intervention, and support services to address all the influences on a student's decision to use or avoid substances.

## Data Sources and General Information

This report summarizes all data submitted by the Student Assistance Program (SAP) counselor and entered into the database. There are two forms used through the year, the “Monthly Statistical Form” and the “Tracking Form.” The “Monthly Statistical Form” is submitted each month and summarizes the SAP activities completed during the month. The “Tracking Forms” are to be completed for each student seen one on one or in groups.

If, on page one of the report, the category “Students Seen One on One or in Groups” is greater than zero, “Tracking Forms” should have been completed at the end of the school year. Lack of tracking forms when required impacts the funding for the following school year. The school will not receive the final grant payment.

In general, SAPs in schools serving students in grades six and above will usually need to provide some one on one or group prevention or intervention services necessitating the use of the tracking forms or students may not be receiving all the services the program is designed to provide. 



Note: In some cases the number of referrals shown on this page is different from the number of referrals for SA Assessment and Counseling on the previous page. This is because the flow diagram includes only those students screened for substance use by the SAP counselor. Of those screened, this diagram shows if the counselor then indicated a referral was indicated. If a student was screened, but the counselor noted a substance abuse referral was not indicated, the student may be referred for services other than a substance abuse assessment such as VKAT or other in-school resources. That information is not included in this flow diagram. If a student was not screened but was referred, they won't appear on the flow diagram. The goal is that each student using substances be screened with a validated and standardized substance abuse screening tool and referred for assessment as needed.
