

Vermont EMT-Intermediate Without NREMT-I Certification

An existing Vermont EMT-Intermediate may obtain initial NR-AEMT certification by successfully completing a state-approved EMT-I to AEMT transition course and passing the NR-AEMT cognitive and psychomotor examinations.

Please note that Vermont does not require transitioning Vermont EMT-Intermediates to become certified at the National Registry AEMT level; however, once you obtain a NR-AEMT certification, you are required to maintain it for the duration of your Vermont AEMT licensure.

Vermont Transition Requirements

All Vermont EMT-Intermediates will have one registration cycle (two years) to complete a state approved Intermediate/85 to Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT) transition course, regardless of whether they opt to become a National AEMT.

Completion of a state-approved transition course must be validated by a certificate that has within its title:

- your name
- transition course completion date
 - The certificate must contain the following statement: "has completed a state approved EMT-Intermediate/85 to Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT) transition course."
- name of the sponsoring agency
- signature of the individual responsible for the training

How to obtain a National Registry AEMT certification

- 1) Create an online NREMT account at www.nremt.org (if you don't already have one)
- 2) Log into your NREMT online account:
 - a) Click on the link "Create a Refresher Application", select "Advanced EMT (AEMT)" and fill out the application.
 - b) In the "Initial Course Completion Date" field, enter the date your INITIAL EMT-I course ended (an approximate date will suffice)
 - c) In the "Refresher Course Completion Date" field, enter the end date of your VT transition course
- 3) You will be contacted by a NREMT Certifications Representative who will ask

you to provide:

- a) A copy of your current state license card
 - b) A copy of your EMT-I to AEMT course completion certificate. These documents will serve to verify your successful completion of an initial EMT-I course and a state-approved AEMT transition course.

- 4) Upon approval of your online application, NR-EMT will provide an Authorization to Test letter (accessed via your online account) with instructions for scheduling the cognitive examination. The Vermont Department of Health will pay for all attempts on the NR-AEMT cognitive examination for all transitioning Vermont AEMTs seeking NR-AEMT certification for the first time. To arrange for state payment, contact the EMS Office.
 - 5) Register for the NR-AEMT psychomotor examination by contacting the EMS Office **AT LEAST FOUR WEEKS** prior to the desired exam date. A list of NR-AEMT psychomotor examinations can be found in the Exam Schedule link of the Vermont EMS website.
 - 6) Pass the NR-AEMT cognitive and psychomotor examinations.

Your NREMT-B or NR-EMT certification will be discontinued upon your becoming an NR-AEMT.
