

Vermont First Responder-ECA With a Current National Registry of EMTs First Responder Certification

All current NREMT First Responders have one registration cycle (two years) to complete a state approved First Responder to Emergency Medical Responder transition course in order to be eligible for National EMS Certification as an Emergency Medical Responder (NREMR).

- Complete a state-approved transition course validated by a certificate that has within its title:
 - First Responder's name
 - Transition course completion date and hours
 - The statement: "has completed a state approved First Responder to Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) transition course."
 - Name of the sponsoring agency or district
 - Signature of the individual responsible for the training
- To transition to the EMR level, the First Responder is not required to complete a National EMS Certification Examination.
- NREMT First Responders who do not attend the required state approved transition course from First Responder to EMR will be dropped from the registry of National EMS Certification upon reaching their expiration date of September 30, 2015 or 2016.

You must maintain your NR-EMR certification for the duration of your Vermont EMR license.
