**STATE'S RESPONSE TO RESPONDENT'S PETITION FOR
RELIEF FROM CONDITIONS**

NOW COME David D. Aronson, M.D. (Respondent), and the State of Vermont, by and through Attorney General William H. Sorrell and the undersigned, Assistant Attorney General Terry Lovelace, and agree and stipulate as follows:

1. David D. Aronson, M.D., Respondent, holds Vermont Medical License Number 042-0008219, issued on September 10, 1990. Respondent is an orthopaedic surgeon and holds privileges at Fletcher Allen Health Care.

2. Jurisdiction vests with the Vermont Board of Medical Practice (Board), pursuant to 26 V.S.A. §§ 1353, 1354, & 1398 and 3 V.S.A. §§ 809 & 814(c).

3. The Vermont Board of Medical Practice on September 15, 2005 opened this matter for investigation based on Respondent's medical leave of absence from Fletcher Allen Health Care, effective July 1, 2005. Respondent pursued a diagnostic assessment and comprehensive care of his medical needs on an inpatient basis. He later entered into a care contract with the Vermont Practitioner Health Program (VPHP).

4. On August 29, 2005, Respondent returned to research, teaching, academic, and administrative responsibilities at Fletcher Allen Health Care. Respondent's medical privileges were reinstated in October 2005.

5. Respondent's license to practice medicine in the State of Vermont was designated as "Conditioned" for a period of five years, retroactive to the September 12, 2005 VPHP contract date.

6. Upon expiration of the five year term of conditions on September 12, 2010, Respondent remains in full compliance with all of the conditions placed upon his license.

7. Suzanne Parker, M.D., Medical Director of the Vermont Practitioner Health Program (VPHP) asserts that Dr. Aronsson has been "fully compliant during his tenure with VPHP and that his illness is in full sustained remission." Further, in her August 31, 2010 correspondence Dr. Parker states that "Respondent is able to practice medicine in a safe manner consistent with medical and community standards."

8. Respondent has resumed full clinical privileges at FAHC.


9. The South Committee recommends that the Board terminate all conditions on Petitioner's licensure. The State concurs with that recommendation.
